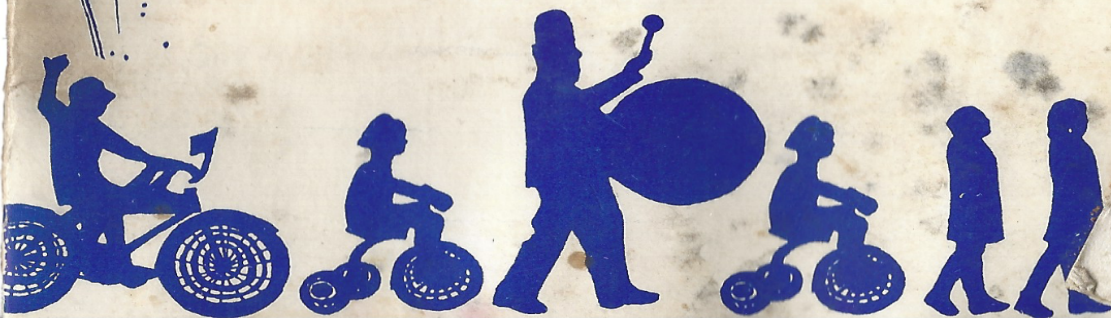



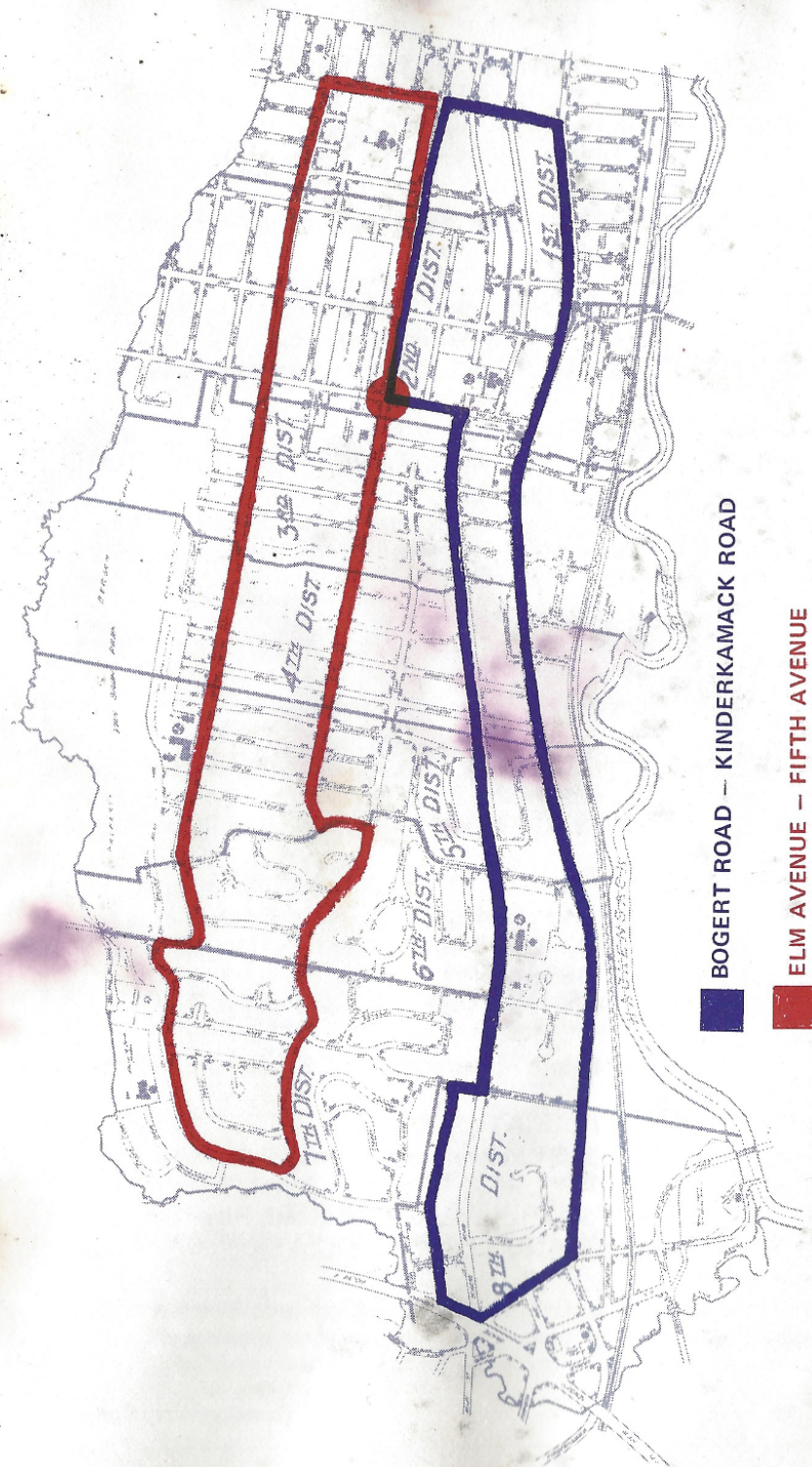

Hints for a more enjoyable Fourth Festivities

- Date** July 5, 1976. Steuben House ceremony 10:00 A.M. Parade 11:00 A.M. Fair starts 12:00 noon. Concert 8:00 P.M. No rain date.
- Motorbus** Two distinctively marked buses are scheduled from 11 A.M. to 11 P.M. to travel routes convenient to all residents for transportation to and from the fair grounds. There will be no charge for this service. Itineraries are listed on facing page.
- Automobiles** Please leave cars home and walk or take a bus to fair grounds if at all possible in order to avoid congestion. Continental Avenue and Webb Avenue will be closed to all traffic from Elm Avenue to Fourth Avenue.
- Bicycles** Bicycles are suggested as a good alternate means of transportation. However, **NO** bicycles will be permitted on the fair grounds (Veterans Memorial Park). **Park and Lock** your bicycles at Roosevelt School "Bike Racks".
- Pets** Please leave pets at home. They and we will enjoy the day more.
- Beer** **NO BEER** can be served to anyone under 18.
- Fireworks** Fireworks of any type are against the law and cannot be permitted. Violators will be prosecuted.
- Flags** We urge you to display the flag at home on the Fourth of July.
- Seats** **BRING CAMP CHAIRS AND (OR) BLANKETS** for picnicking and seating for evening entertainment. We encourage Senior Citizens to bring comfortable chairs if they intend to remain for the day.
